RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

23RD NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Fourth Year, 2018

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LAW AND ORDER, HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, BUDGET AND FINANCE, AND NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING AMENDMENTS TO 12 N.N.C. § 1176 OF THE NAVAJO NATION VETERANS TRUST FUND

BE IT ENACTED:

Section One. Authority

- A. The Law and Order Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council and as such is empowered to review and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed amendments and enactments to the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. § 600 (A) and § 601(B)(14).
- B. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council and as such serves as the oversight authority for veterans services. 2 N.N.C. § 400 (A) and § 400 (B) (6) (a).
- C. The Budget and Finance Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council and exercises oversight authority over budget and finance for the purposes of recommending to the Navajo Nation Council the adoption of resolutions designed to strengthen the fiscal and financial position of the Navajo Nation and to promote the efficient use of the fiscal and financial resources of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §§ 300 (A) and 300 (C)(3).
- D. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. A proposed resolution that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council shall be assigned to the standing committee having authority over the subject matter at issue and the Naabik'íyáti' Committee. 2 N.N.C. §\$ 164(A)(9) and 700(A).
- E. The Navajo Nation Council must review and approve enactments or amendments of positive law. 2 N.N.C. \$\$ 164(A).
- F. Amendments to 12 N.N.C § 1176 may be made upon recommendation of the Health, Education and Human Services Committee and the Budget and Finance Committee by a

majority vote of the full membership of the Navajo Nation Council. 12 N.N.C. § 1178.

Section Two. Findings

- A. The needs of Navajo veterans have increased since the Navajo Nation Veterans Trust Fund was created through Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJY-46-98.
- B. Resolutions in support of this amendment have been approved by the five Navajo Agency Veterans Organizations. These supporting resolutions are attached as **Exhibits A through E**.
- C. Supporting resolutions have also been approved by Casamero Lake Chapter, Tsayatoh Chapter, and Coyote Canyon Chapter Veterans Organization. These supporting resolutions are attached as **Exhibits F through H**.

Section Three. Amendments to Title 12

The Navajo Nation amends the Navajo Nation Code 12 N.N.C. § 1176, as follows:

NAVAJO NATION CODE ANNOTATED TITLE 12. FISCAL MATTERS CHAPTER 10. NAVAJO NATION TRUST FUNDS SUBCHAPTER 8. NAVAJO NATION VETERANS TRUST FUND

§ 1176. Expenditure of Trust Fund

The Fund income shall not be expended, except as in § 1177, from Fiscal Year 1998 to Fiscal Year 2003. From Fiscal Year 2004, the Fund income shall be expended as follows:

A. Four 75 percent (4 75%) of the average market value total income earned, plus the current projected set aside of the Fund covering the past three fiscal years will be used as supplemental funding for programs and services to benefit veterans, as noted under § 1172 on an annual basis, excluding two percent (2%), which shall be for the exclusive use of the Veterans Housing Program in accordance with 2 N.N.C § 1171 (A) and Navajo Nation Council Resolution CS-56-17. The market value of the Fund's income earned at the end of the previous audited fiscal year plus the current fiscal year projected set aside 12 quarters will be used to determine the average market value of the Fund for allowable expenditure (i.e. budget purposes). The excess of the Fund income over expenditures shall be

reinvested in the Fund to cover the rate of inflation and to provide for reasonable Fund growth.

- B. Tribal grants to non-tribal government programs and projects shall be awarded in accordance with rules and regulations developed by the Department of Navajo Veterans Affairs, in consultation with the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council and, if required, the Navajo Nation Council.
- C. Of the four 75 percent (4 75%) of the Fund (Market Value), total amount as set forth in paragraph A, ninety-five percent (95%) of the proceeds will be used for subsections (A) and (B) of this Section and five percent (5%) will be used for administrative purposes, and this be reviewed further by the Office of Management and Budget and the Program.

Except as provided at § 1177, all Trust Fund income distribution shall be determined pursuant to all eligible Navajo veterans and distributed among those applicable Navajo Nation chapters to be expended in accordance with § 1172 of this Plan.

Section Four. Codification

The provisions of the Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

Section Five. Saving Clause

Should any provision of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

Section Six. Effective Date

The provisions of this Act shall become effective in accordance with 2 N.N.C. \S 221(B).

The Eastern Navajo Agency Veterans Organization and membership had their regular monthly meeting on February 09, 2017, at Tsayatoh Chapter house, during this meeting the Honorable Delegate Seth Damon of the Budget & Finance Chairperson informed the Eastern Navajo Agency Veterans Organization, that he is proposing a legislation to increase the earned income interest rate from four per-cent to ten percent with Navajo Nation Veterans Allowable expenditures.
