RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 24th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - THIRD YEAR, 2021

AN ACTION

RELATING TO HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT, LAW AND ORDER, BUDGET AND FINANCE, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE TRANSFER OF THE NAVAJO TRANSIT SYSTEM FROM THE NAVAJO DIVISION OF GENERAL SERVICES TO THE NAVAJO DIVISION OF TRANSPORTATION; AMENDING THE NAVAJO TRANSIT SYSTEM PLAN OF OPERATION AND ORGANIZATIONAL CHART; AND AMENDING 2 N.N.C. § 1252(B)(8)-(9)

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITIES

- A. The Navajo Nation Council enacts laws and sets policy for the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102.
- B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with authority to review proposed legislation that requires final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- C. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee is the standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the creation of any Division or Department intended to be under the Committee's oversight, by adoption of its Plan of Operation; and to rescind that Plan of Operation for any Division or Department under the Committee's oversight. 2 N.N.C. §§ 400(A), 401(B)(8).
- D. The Resources and Development Committee is the standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the creation of any Division or Department intended to be under the Committee's oversight, by adoption of its Plan of Operation. 2 N.N.C. §§ 500(A), 501(B)(14).
- E. The Law and Order Committee is the standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to review and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed amendments to the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. §§ 600(A), 601(B)(14).
- F. The Budget and Finance Committee is the standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the authority to review and

recommend to the Navajo Nation Council the budgeting, appropriation, investment, and management of all funds. $2 \times 10^{-5} =$

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Government Services Committee established the Master Plan of Operation for the Division of General Services along with the Plan of Operation for the Navajo Transit System. Pursuant to Resolution No. GSCS-69-95. The Government Services Committee was rescinded and replaced by the Health, Education and Human Services Committee pursuant to CAP-10-11, incorporated by reference.
- B. The Navajo Transit System is currently operating under the Navajo Division of General Services, and the Health, Education and Human Services Committee is the legislative oversight Committee.
- C. The Navajo Nation desires to transfer the Navajo Transit System from Navajo Division of General Services to the Navajo Division of Transportation. When the Navajo Transit System is transferred to the Navajo Division of Transportation, the Resources and Development Committee will be the legislative oversight Committee. See Exhibit A.
- D. The Navajo Nation Department of Justice reviewed the amendments to the Navajo Transit System Plan of Operation, Organizational Chart, and 2 N.N.C. § 1252(B)(8)-(9) and determined the transfer and these changes to be legally sufficient. Attached as Exhibit B.
- E. The Navajo Nation finds it to be in the best interest to transfer the Navajo Transit System from the Navajo Division of General Services to the Navajo Division of Transportation, and to amend the Plan of Operation and Organizational Chart, and 2 N.N.C. § 1252(B)(8)-(9).

SECTION THREE. AMENDING AND APPROVING THE NAVAJO TRANSIT SYSTEM PLAN OF OPERATION AND ORGANIZATIONAL CHART

The Navajo Nation Council hereby approves the amended Navajo Transit System Plan of Operation along with the amended Organizational Chart pursuant to **Exhibit A**.

SECTION FOUR. APPROVING AND AMENDING 2 N.N.C. § 1252(B)(8)-(9)

The Navajo Nation Council hereby amends 2 N.N.C. § 1252(B)(8)-(9) as follows:

THE NAVAJO NATION CODE TITLE 2 NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT Chapter 5. Executive Branch Subchapter 11. Division of General Services

§ 1252. Purposes and Objectives

B. The objectives of the Division of General Services shall include:

- 8. Providing a ground transportation system for the Navajo people by offering low cost fixed route services on and around the Navajo Nation and by offering charter services to various groups in and around the Navajo Nation.
- 9.8. Maintaining custodial care of all vital official Navajo Nation Government records and providing duplicating services for the Government.

SECTION FIVE. DIRECTIVE

The Navajo Nation hereby directs the following entities to make all necessary changes as follows:

- A. The Navajo Nation Office of the Controller, Office of Management and Budget, Department of Personnel Management, and all other affected Navajo Nation entities shall implement the necessary changes to reflect the transfer of the Navajo Transit System from the Division of General Services to the Navajo Division of Transportation set forth herein.
- B. The Navajo Division of Transportation and the Navajo Division of General Services shall update all necessary documents and other items to reflect the changes set forth herein.

SECTION SIX. CODIFICATION

The provisions of the Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

SECTION SEVEN. SAVING CLAUSE

Should any provision of this Act be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court or the District Courts of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, the remainder of the Act shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

SECTION EIGHT. EFFECTIVE DATE

The provisions of this Act shall become effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B).

PLAN OF OPERATION

Updated September, 2021

I. ESTABLISHMENT

There is hereby established the Navajo Transit System within the Navajo Division of General Services Transportation of the Navajo Nation Government Executive Branch.

II. PURPOSE

Transportation transit services to be performed are described as follows:

A. Fixed Route Services:

To operate and serve as a common carrier, by motor vehicle, in interstate and or foreign commerce, over regular routes, transporting passengers and their baggage, newspapers and express mail, between points in New Mexico, Arizona, Utah and beyond these areas, if necessary.

B. Charter Services:

To provide irregular motor coach routes of passengers and their baggage, in the same vehicle under special operations, between points in Arizona and New Mexico and other points in Arizona. New Mexico, Utah, Colorado, California, Nevada, Idaho, Oregon, Washington, Oklahoma, Texas, Kansas, Mississippi, Illinois, Arkansas, Tennessee, North Carolina, Virginia, Missouri, Louisiana, and the District of Columbia, in compliance with 49 U.S.C. §5323(d) and 49 C.F.R. Part 604 and as approved by funding agencies.

III. STAFF AND ORGANIZATION

A. STAFFING

1. There shall be a <u>Director-Manager</u> of Navajo Transit System. The <u>Director-Manager</u> of the Navajo Transit System Department shall be hired by the Division Director of the Navajo Division of <u>General Services-Transportation</u> pursuant to Personnel Policies of the Navajo Nation Government and report to the Executive Director of the Division

of General Services. The Manager of Navajo Transit System shall report to and under the direct supervision of the Division Director of the Navajo Division of Transportation.

The Director-Manager shall be authorized to recommend additional professional, technical and clerical positions as needed to execute purposes stated herein. Additional personnel positions shall be acquired in accordance with Navajo Nation Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual and applicable budget rules established for conducting the annual Navajo Nation budget process.

B. ORGANIZATION

The organizational chart of the Navajo Transit System is displayed as Attachment I.

IV. RESPONSIBILITY AND AUTHORITY

- A. The Director Manager and staff of Navajo Transit System is hereby authorized and responsible to:
 - 1. Administer and operate both—fixed routes—and charter public transportation services.
 - 2. Administer and operate limited charter services as approved by funding sources on a case-by-case basis.
 - 3. Assure compliance with guidelines, rules, regulations and requirements set by the funding sources and the Navajo Nation Council.
 - 4. Communicate tariffs and motor coach bus fare rates to all necessary Navajo Nation agencies.
 - 5. Provide safe and reliable public transportation services.
 - 6. Collect daily <u>bus</u> fare <u>rates and</u>, compile <u>Recap</u> data, <u>reconcile tickets</u> and <u>revenue</u> and submit daily depository of funds to Cashiers. Analyze daily ticket count for customary receipts.
 - 5. Prepares performance reports for Federal funding compliance.

- 6. Prepare reports, budgets and revisions, daily bookkeeping, Purchase Requisitions, Request for Direct Payment (RDP), Interdepartmental Charge Requisitions (ICR), final accounting.
- 7. Prepare and manage budgets, expenditures, revenue, inventory, and financial reporting.
- 8. Maintain NTS fleet of buses, vans and all its assets including administrative office, buildings, parking lots, garages, etc.
- 9. Manage daily fixed routes schedules and daily driver's schedules.
- 10. Assure safety in all aspects of Transit operations.
- 11. Assure a reasonable level of customer service.
- 12. Provide necessary training to staff.
- 13. Abide by the Navajo Nation Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual (NNPPM) and shall in no way influence or pressure staff members on any political matters, applicable Navajo Nation laws, regulations and policies.
- 14. Other duties as assigned by the Division Director.

B. Navajo Transit System – Operating Authority:

1. The Navajo Transit System became operational in November 1980, and on April 11. 1983, received its permanent operating authority, the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity from the Federal Interstate Commerce Commission, attached hereto as Attachment II. This certificate is evidence of the Navajo Transit System's authority to engage in transportation as a common carrier by Motor Vehicle, as established by the Navajo Nation Council.

V. LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT

The Government Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council shall provide legislative oversight for the Navajo Transit System pursuant to 2 N.T.C §343 (b)(4).

The Navajo Transit System, Navajo Division of Transportation, shall operate under the legislative oversight of the Resource and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C.§500 and §501(B)(2)(g).

VI. AMENDMENTS

This Plan of Operation may be amended by the Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council as deemed necessary.

NAVAJO TRANSIT SYSTEM ORGANIZATION CHART


