RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - SECOND YEAR, 2024

AN ACT

RELATING TO LAW AND ORDER, HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES, NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEES, AND THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING 2 N.N.C. §§ 1651-1656, AND § 401(C); CHANGING THE NAME OF THE DIVISION OF SOCIAL SERVICES TO THE DIVISION FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Law and Order Committee is empowered to review and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation Council on proposed amendments and enactments to the Navajo Nation Code. 2 N.N.C. § 601(B)(14).
- B. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee has oversight of the Division of social Services. 2 N.N.C. § 401(C).
- C. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee considers proposed resolutions that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- D. The Navajo Nation Council approves enactments and amendments of positive law. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Division of Social Services was established in the Executive Branch. 2 N.N.C. § 1651.
- B. The Division is requesting a name change from Division of Social Services to Division for Children and Family Services to emphasize the work it does with children and families.

SECTION THREE. AMENDMENTS TO TITLE 2 OF THE NAVAJO NATION CODE

The Navajo Nation hereby approves amendments to the Navajo Nation Code, Title 2, as follows:

NAVAJO NATION CODE
TITLE 2. NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT

CHAPTER 3. LEGISLATIVE BRANCH SUBCHAPTER 9. STANDING COMMITTEES

Article 2. Health, Education, and Human Services Committee

C. Oversight.

 To serve as the oversight Committee for the Division of Health, Division for Children and Family of Social Services, Division of Human Resources Department of Diné Education, Division of General Services and to review, recommend or propose the adoption, amendment or rescission of its Plan of Operation.

NAVAJO NATION CODE TITLE 2. NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT CHAPTER 5. EXECUTIVE BRANCH SUBCHAPTER 25. DIVISION OF SOCIAL FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES

§ 1651. Establishment

There is hereby established the Navajo Division for Children and Family of Social Services within the Executive Branch of the Navajo Nation.

§ 1652. Purposes

The purpose of the Navajo Division for Children and Family of Social Services shall be to provide the Navajo people with such essential social services as approved and authorized by the Navajo Nation Council and to ensure the highest quality of social welfare programs for the Navajo people by coordinating with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and other federal, state and private entities.

§ 1653. Personnel

The Navajo Division <u>for Children and Family of Social</u> Services shall be administered by an Executive Director whose appointment shall be made by the President of the Navajo Nation and confirmed by the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation of the Health, <u>Education</u> and <u>Social Human</u> Services Committee of the Navajo Nation

Council and who shall serve at the pleasure of the President of the Navajo Nation. The Executive Director may employ a Deputy Director and shall employ such other personnel as may be deemed necessary to carry out the purposes of the Division. All personnel shall be subject to the Personnel Policies and Procedures of the Executive Branch of the Navajo Nation.

§ 1654. Organization

The Navajo Division <u>for Children and Family of Social</u> Services shall be comprised of such Departments, Programs, Offices and administrative components as may be deemed necessary by the Executive Director to fulfill its purpose, subject to legislative review and approval of the Division's Plan of Operation.

§ 1655. Legislative Oversight

The Navajo Division for Children and Family of Social Services shall operate under the legislative oversight of the Health, Education and Human Social Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 401(C). 451 et seq. The Division shall operate pursuant to a Plan of Operation approved by the Health, Education and Human Social Services Committee and the Government Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council.

§ 1656. Amendments

Sections 1651 through 1655 may be amended from time to time by the Navajo Nation Council upon recommendation by the Health, <u>Education</u> and <u>Human</u> <u>Social</u> Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council after consultation with the Navajo Division <u>for Children and Family of Social</u> Services.

SECTION FOUR. EFFECTIVE DATE

The amendments enacted herein shall be effective pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221.

SECTION FIVE. CODIFICATION

The provisions of the Act which amend or adopt new sections of the Navajo Nation Code shall be codified by the Office of Legislative Counsel. The Office of Legislative Counsel shall incorporate such amended provisions in the next codification of the Navajo Nation Code.

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

Should any portion of the amendment enacted herein be determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or the District Court of the Navajo Nation, without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those portions not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

CERTIFICATION
